



General Information for Pilots Flying to Temora Aerodrome for Warbirds Downunder - October 19th & 20th, 2024

Warbirds Downunder

Temora Aviation Museum presents Warbirds Downunder on October 19th & 20th 2024. This two day event will be an airshow featuring an incredible collection of warbird and vintage aircraft and current serving military aircraft from around Australia.

To enable the day to flow smoothly, Temora Aviation Museum, Temora Historic Flight Club, Temora Shire Council, and Temora Aeroclub are implementing arrival, departure and parking procedures for all visiting aircraft. Arrival

Temora Aerodrome is served by three runways and the duty runway will depend on the conditions of the day. Pilots are encouraged to check NOTAMs before arrival. Ensure you specifically check for D427 and TRA Temora as well as YTEM.

Unicom

A Unicom service will be operating for Warbirds Downunder on Temora CTAF **126.15** with arrival and departure advice offered. Temora Aerodrome has an AWIB available on **134.45**. This is a non-continuous broadcast device and requires a short transmission on the frequency to activate the AWIB for two minutes.

We encourage all visitors flying in to pre-purchase admission tickets online from the Museum's website at <https://warbirdsdownunderairshow.com.au/general-admission/> before October 19th to receive early bird prices and enjoy a streamlined entry process.

Aircraft Parking

General parking for all aviators will be immediately West of the approach end of Runway 36 (see attached map). This area was specifically prepared by Temora Shire Council as an aircraft parking area. Marshalls will direct you for parking. Access to your aircraft **will not be permitted** during the air display as the aircraft parking area is under the CASA designated aerobatic display flight line. Please remember to take all your personal belongings with you when you leave your aircraft as you **will not be permitted** to return until after the flying display has finished.

Transport from the aircraft parking area to Warbirds Downunder entry area will be provided. As the airfield will still be active upon your arrival, pilots and passengers **will not be permitted** to walk across the airfield. A shuttle service will also be provided to return you to your aircraft after the flying display.

The sealed tarmac areas around the Temora Aviation Museum, Temora Aeroclub and further north near the new Airpark Estate Area are reserved for airshow participating aircraft, jets and aircraft that require pavement. These areas will not be available for general parking. Please consider this restriction if you intend to arrive earlier in the week prior to Thursday 17th October, as it will save you the effort of moving your aircraft.

Please do not bring any pets. Only Guide Dogs or registered assistance dogs will be allowed entry to Warbirds Downunder.

Jet and Large Aircraft Parking

All operators of jet, turbo prop and large aircraft (DC-3 etc) are encouraged to contact Andrew Bishop on **0414 285 556** or engineering@aviationmuseum.com.au in advance to ensure adequate parking is available. You will also need to contact Temora Shire Council on 02 6980 1100 if a pavement concession is required.

Aircraft Parking – Wet Weather

If substantial rain is received in the week leading up to Warbirds Downunder, and Temora Shire Council deems that grass areas are too soft, Council will close Runway 09/27 and make it available for aircraft parking. If these arrangements are in place, all aviators will need to be patient with marshallers as aircraft may need to be pushed into place after shut down. Please bring a portable towbar/steering arm for your aircraft.

SAR

Please remember to cancel SAR!

Tie Downs for all Aircraft

Please bring tie down pegs and ropes/straps for your aircraft. All aircraft are required to be tied down in case of inclement weather.

Fuel

Avgas and Jet-A1 fuel will be available Thursday, Friday and Saturday via tanker trucks from Viva/Skyfuel. Forms of payment accepted are Visa, Master Card, Diners, American Express and Cheque. Call **Rob Mangan** on **0418 862 100** before or during your visit to arrange fuel.

Times for Saturday October 19th (local time)

- 1030 Temora Aerodrome will close with Restricted Area TRA Temora becoming active to enable the Air Display to commence.
- 1700 The Aerodrome will not re-open until after the Air Display has finished at approximately 1700 (5.00pm local time).

Times for Sunday October 20th (local time)

- 1030 Temora Aerodrome will close with Restricted Area TRA Temora becoming active to enable the Air Display to commence.
- 1700 The Aerodrome will not re-open until after the Air Display has finished at approximately 1700 (5.00pm local time).

Note: During times of TRA Temora activation, Temora Aerodrome will be closed to all traffic except airshow participants, or aircraft declaring an emergency. Please plan your arrival and departure times outside of Restricted Area Activation.

Departures

A Unicom service will be operating after Warbirds Downunder which will assist all pilots with a coordinated and expeditious departure. **Unicom - 126.15.**

Camping

Under-wing camping is not available for Warbirds Downunder. There are two camping areas available on the Aerodrome including the Squadron Tent Barracks which is set up as a tent village and very handy for those that fly in.

The Unicom Operators who have volunteered their services for Warbirds Downunder have worked at many airshows and fly-ins around Australia. Based on their experiences over the years, they have offered some notes to assist you with your visit to Warbirds Downunder 2024.

Additional Notes from the Unicom Operators for Warbirds Downunder 2024

Before and after the Air Display (airshow), the airspace within 5NM of TEM will be a Danger Area (D427), and a Unicom service will provide advice.

During the Air Display, the airspace via NOTAM will be a Restricted Area TRA Temora SFC-10,000FT and 7NM.

Given the complexity and duration of the Air Display, the commencement of the Air Display cannot be delayed to accommodate late arrivals. If you are late, you will not be allowed to land. **Please plan ahead so that you can land at Temora before 10.30am (local time) Saturday and Sunday.**

It is recommended that you:

- Study NOTAMs and Area Forecasts.
- Plan for headwinds.
- Get the AWIB early (**134.45**) on the way in (available up to 30NM)
- Listen out on CTAF early (**126.15**).
- Call at 10NM; keep calls short.
- Call in the circuit.
- Landing lights on, look out.

Once the Air Display is finished, Runway 23 is preferred for departure to avoid a traffic jam and dust blowing in the parking area. Be patient.

Warbirds are the heart of our airshow and have to get home too. Liquid cooled engines overheat very quickly, and the Unicom will endeavour to process departures for aircraft with liquid cooled engines without ground delays; please cooperate.

Please note that tailwheel aircraft, in particular tailwheel warbirds, do not offer pilots the same level of visibility from the cockpit as nose wheel aircraft. Please remember this when operating near tailwheel aircraft. Even if you have the right of way, do not assume that the pilot of a tailwheel aircraft can see you.

Plan, listen out, use the radio and be patient to ensure efficient and safe operations for everyone.
